A new collaborative initiative at the University of Kentucky is working to better support children and teens struggling with mental health challenges with the help of 4-H summer camps, which provide positive experiences for children and teens by building social skills and creating supportive networks.

Poor mental health among young people is a severe and growing problem across the U.S.

In fact, according to a 2019 study from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, more than 36% of adolescents experienced persistent sadness or hopelessness, and more than 15% experienced a major depressive episode.

To better support the well-being of young people, the College of Social Work has partnered with the College of Agriculture, Food and Environment and UK Cooperative Extension Service to launch the 4-H Camp Behavioral Health Fellow Program. The initiative works to hire and train qualified behavioral health specialists — ultimately increasing the capacity to address mental health issues of campers. "We are grateful for this new partnership in the spirit of collaboration through the UK Engage program," Nancy Cox, dean of CAFE, said. "The College of Social work is indispensable to our 4-H program."

The 4-H Camp Behavioral Health Fellow Program focuses on camp preparedness, educational outreach and engagement, real-time incident response and service connection and communication.

Fellows will be tasked with educating camp counselors on the signs of and strategies surrounding mental and behavioral health issues, as well (continue to page 3)

(continued from page 2) as be available to respond to incidents that occur during camp. They will also work with young people, their caregivers and camp personnel to coordinate services prior to and after attending camp experiences.

Fellows enrolled in the graduate program in the College of Social Work will participate in a variety of practice-oriented activities, including multi-modal training, field practicum and educational continuum. This training will also include behavioral and mental health field rotations, camp-based simulation exercises and 4-H research experiences. "This innovative program will go a long way in bolstering behavioral and mental health supports to young people, caregivers and communities across the Commonwealth," Jay Miller, dean of the College of Social Work, said. "What's more, this approach embodies the principles set forth by Provost DiPaola's Quality Enhancement Plan, Transdisciplinary Educational approaches to advance Kentucky."

The first cohort of 4-H Camp Behavioral Health Fellows will begin the field portion of the program this summer. Want more info?



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April BioBlitz- Instructions

- 1. To participate, you will need access to an iNaturalist account. An account can be created online at www.inaturalist.org or using the iNaturalist app on your smartphone (available for iPhones, iPads, Androids, and Android tablets). An account and the app are free, but users must be thirteen years of age or older to create an account, and all youth must have their parent's or guardian's permission to participate. Youth can also partner with an adult (such as a parent, relative, 4-H leader) and participate as a team using the adult's iNaturalist account.
- 2. Once on iNaturalist, you and/or your team will need to join the Kentucky 4-H BioBlitz Project.
 - a. If using the iNaturalist website, use the website's search tool at the top left to search for "Kentucky 4-H BioBlitz Project – April 2023". Select the project. A new page will load with information about the Kentucky 4-H BioBlitz Project. Click Join at the top right of the website. A new page will load with additional information about the project. At the bottom of this page, you must select "Yes, I want to join" to join.
 - b. If using the iNaturalist app, open the app on your smartphone. Click on More at the bottom righthand side of the screen. Click on Projects. Click the magnifying glass/search tool. Enter "Kentucky 4-H BioBlitz Project April 2023". Select the project. Click Join.
- 3. Choose a location to find and identify plants and/or animals. This location can be anywhere in Kentucky (such as a yard, neighborhood, park, farm, etc.).
- 4. Find, photograph, and identify plants and/or animals at your chosen location. For this project, the focus is wildlife wild, undomesticated animals and plants. Domesticated animals, such as pets and livestock, should not be included.
 - a. If you are using a smartphone and have internet access, open your iNaturalist app. Click on Observe at the bottom of the screen. Select Camera. Take a photograph of the plant or animal you are observing. Select Use Photo (or you can also select to Retake the Photo). A new screen will appear asking for details of the photo. Click on What did you see?. A new screen will appear with suggestions on what that plant or animal is, and you can also search species by name on this screen. Once you feel you know what the plant or animal is, select the name of that species. Once the name is selected, you will be taken back to the Details page. Click on the Projects icon and select the Kentucky 4-H BioBlitz Project – April 2023. Lastly, click Share.
 - b. If you are using a smartphone and do not have internet access, simply take photographs of plants and animals you observe. Use a notebook to record additional observations if needed (such as location, date, time however, your smartphone may record this information for photos you take depending on the settings of your phone). Once at a location with internet access, open your iNaturalist app. Click on Observe at the bottom of the screen. Select Camera Roll. Select the photograph of the plant or animal you observed. Select Next. A new screen will appear asking for details of the photo. Click on What did you see?. A new screen will appear with suggestions on what that plant or animal is, and you can also search species by name on this screen. Once you feel you know what the plant or animal is, select the name of that species. Once the name is selected, you will be taken back to the Details page. Click on the Projects icon and select the Kentucky 4-H BioBlitz Project April 2023. You may also need to insert the date and location of the photo. Lastly, click Share.
 - c. If you are using a digital camera and notebook to make observations, simply take photographs of plants and animals you observe, using a notebook to record the date, time, location, and any additional information about the plant or animal you photograph. Once at a location with internet access, download the digital photographs to your computer and/or smart phone, and then follow the instructions above for uploading those photos in iNaturalist via the website or app.

ANIMAL SCIENCE & CAREER EXPLORATION VET CAMP SUCCESS STORY

What is Vet Camp?

4-H Vet Camp took place on Wednesday, April 5th at the Breckinridge County Extension Office. This is a program designed for youth grades 3 through 5 to discover the vast world of animal science and the veterinarian career field. This is a day camp that engage participants in hands-on lessons involving live animals, practicing skills with real tools used by veterinarians and animal scientists.

What did our Future Veterinarians Learn?

There were several different topics that were covered during Vet Camp. First, we discussed animal and human safety. We used horses and goats to practice taking vitals. Next, we dissected and learned the different parts of a cow's eye. We then did an activity to show the importance of biosecurity and how quickly diseases and parasites can spread in a herd. We also completed an art project focused on the skeletal and muscular system.


Teen Conference
