

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UK Spring Fencing Schools Coming in April

Good fences mark clear boundaries, keep livestock contained and create a clean aesthetic. Farmers who build and maintain a good fence add value to their farm and protect their assets. The University of Kentucky is hosting two spring fencing schools to give farmers the most upto-date information on fencing techniques and construction.

"This year, we will focus on how to construct both fixed-knot woven wire and smooth, electrified high-tensile fencing," said Chris Teutsch, forage extension specialist for the UK College of Agriculture, Food and Environment. "We plan to emphasize properly constructing H-braces, which are key components of all fencing systems."

The 2023 spring schools are April 11 at the Allen County Extension office in Scottsville and April 13 in Richmond at the SMK Agricultural Venue, 401 Brookstown Road. The schools will run from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. local time.

Teutsch started these one-day events in 2018 to help producers improve infrastructure for better forage and livestock management.

"There are a lot of fences in rural areas of Kentucky. A lot of those have structural issues that make them less effective at containing livestock," Teutsch said. "Our goal is to help farmers learn the basics of building a strong, durable fence that will last a couple of decades or more. If they choose to hire someone else to build fences, we want them to know what a well-constructed fence looks like."

UK specialists and fencing industry experts will use a mixture of classroom instruction and hands-on demonstrations. Each school is limited to 30 participants, and the cost is \$35 per person. This cost covers lunch, a fencing notebook and safety gear. Participants should bring leather gloves for the hands-on portion of the school. 2023 CAIP PROGRAM

The Breckinridge County Conservation District will be conducting the County Agriculture Investment Program (CAIP) #A2023-0012. **This program is sponsored in part by the Kentucky Agriculture Development Fund (KADF).** The Breckinridge County Ag Development Council set the cost share amounts as follows, Primary programs cost share of \$2,000; Secondary Programs cost share of \$1,000, for a MAXIMUM of \$2,000 for the combined programs. These programs will be reimbursed at 50% of the approved receipts.

- Any producers interested in improving their farm business must apply at the Breckinridge County Conservation Office between the dates of February 27, 2023 thru March 31, 2023.
- Applications can be picked up from 7:30 a.m. (ct) through 3 p.m. (ct); except office is closed for lunch from 11 am (ct) to 12 Noon p.m. (ct).
- All interested parties must pick up and return the applications for approval to the office, 1101 S. Hwy 261, Suite 2, Hardinsburg, during the above times.
- All returned applications will be scored and those approved for cost share funds will be notified no later than April 21, 2023 date subject to change. In case of ties, prorating of cost share funds may be necessary to fund each applicant.
- Receipts for cost share practices must be dated from January 1, 2023 thru October 6, 2023.

The cost share programs that may be approved with proper documentation are as follows:

- 1. Agricultural Diversification Secondary Program \$1000
- 2. Large Animal (beef, dairy, equine) Primary Program \$2000
- 3. Small Animal (goat, sheep, swine, bee, rabbits) Primary Program \$2000
- 4. Farm Infrastructure Primary Program \$2000
- 5. Fencing & On-Farm Water Primary Program \$2000
- 6. Forage & Grain Improvement Primary Program \$2000
- 7. Innovative Agricultural Systems Primary Program \$2000
- 8. On-Farm Energy-Primary Program \$2000
- 9. Poultry & Other Fowl Secondary Program \$1000
- 10. AgTech & Leadership Development Primary Program \$2000
- 11. Value-Added & Marketing-Secondary Program \$2000

Important Dates; all review dates subject to change

- 1. Application time, February 27, 2023 thru March 31, 2023. You must fill out an application between these dates, no exceptions.
- 2. If you are approved, you will receive notice of approval no later than April 21, 2023. In case of ties, the funds may be prorated to allow funding for all individuals.
- 3. After notification of approval, you can begin bringing in receipts for practices that have been completed along with proper pictures of projects and fill out a final report.
- 4. Receipts for cost share practices must be dated from January 1, 2023 thru October 6, 2023. All paperwork must be turned in to the Soil Conservation Office by October 6, 2023 before 3 p.m. (ct).
- 5. Pending review and approval of your receipts and final report, you will receive notification that your reimbursement is ready to be picked up.
- 6. If you receive notice that you are on the waiting list then you will be notified as money becomes available for you to complete your project for the CAIP Cost Share Program #A2023-0012.

Applicants must attend an educational class approved by the Breckinridge County Extension Office before receiving payment.

Please stop by the Breckinridge County Soil Conservation Office to pick-up the rules and applications for the programs.

THIS MONTH'S TOPIC:

PREVENT POISONINGS IN YOUR HOME



ational Poison Prevention Week raises awareness of poison prevention during the third full week of March every year. Poisoning occurs when someone ingests a substance that can cause sickness or death. That can mean they swallow it, breathe it, touch it, or splash it in their eye. Sometimes, it is the substance itself that is dangerous because it is not meant for the body. But often, poisoning happens when a person ingests too much of a substance, or misuses a substance, mixes it with other substances, or it is contaminated in some way before ingestion.

The American Cleaning Institute reports that 90% of all poisonings occur in the home. Even though it is the one environment you think people

would have the most control over and would therefore be the safest. This statistic highlights the need for adults to make good choices in their homes. They need to pay attention when it comes to household products that can be a danger to themselves and their family members.

Read the label

Poison prevention at home starts with reading product labels. Turn on the lights, get your glasses, and read product labels, even if you use the item often. This includes medications, cleaners, repair products such as glue, or project supplies like paint and stain.

Pay close attention to products whose labels include words like "Caution," "Warning," "Danger," or "Poison." If you have any questions about how to use or store the item, call the toll-free number found on most product labels.

Share safety with others

There are some simple tips you can share with your friends and family to help keep poisoning accidents from happening:

- Always read and follow product label directions for proper use, storage, and disposal.
- Store cleaning products in a closed area that is away from food and not accessible to young children or pets.
- Store products in their original containers and keep the original label intact. Product use and storage, disposal instructions, precautions, and first aid instructions vary according to their ingredients.
- Do not mix cleaning solutions or other chemicals.
- Keep medications in a secured area out of the reach of children. Supervise children when they are taking a medication, even vitamins or supplements.
- Consult your pharmacist about taking multiple medications at once and taking any over-the-counter medications along with prescription medications. Never take a medication prescribed to someone else.



Call for help

Keep the number to Poison Help Line (below) posted in an easy-to-find place in your home and in your phone.

If you think someone may have ingested or otherwise been exposed to a harmful product, call the Poison Help Line at 1-800-222-1222. This national number will connect you with your local Poison Control Center.

If the person is in distress, call 911 immediately.
