



enjoy I made them myself! ave you ever heard of the saying, "It is better to give than to receive?" and wondered what it means? This saying means that there are more benefits to giving something to someone else than someone else giving something to you. How can it be better to give than to get?

When you are little, your parents and teachers
tell you to be nice to others. They teach you how to share. While it might be hard to be kind or take
turns when you are very small, you usually get pretty good at those things as you get a little older. You can probably think of lots of small
ways that you wait your turn and show kindness without really thinking about it. This shows how much you have learned and grown over time!

Another way that you show kindness and share with others is to give. Giving to others is called being generous. When you are generous, you show

You could give toys or clothes to other kids who need them in your town. Or you and your family could buy and give food to a local food bank for families who need it.
