

Culinary Challenge

This Challenge generates interest among foodies and food show fans and adds excitement to 4-H food and nutrition projects. The Kentucky 4-H Culinary Challenge fosters mastery of food preparation and food safety skills; belonging by working together to accomplish a goal; independence by developing the skills needed to eat healthy foods for a lifetime, and generosity by teaching these skills to others. Teams of two to four are challenged to create a dish using three secret ingredients, supplemented with items from the pantry. They rely on the skills learned rather than a recipe. Teams present their creation to the judges, explain their decisions, the preparation skills involved, talk about the nutritive value of the food on the plate, and determine the number of servings from the food groups.

Egg Chef Challenge


This challenge teaches 4-H'ers how to prepare nutritious, safe meals and snacks using eggs as the main ingredient. The contest challenges individual youth to create an egg dish



while demonstrating proper food safety with culinary and cooking skills. The Egg Chef Challenge combines culinary skills with demonstration skills. The youth will also show off their knowledge of eggs and how they can be included in an economical and nutritious meal.

4-H'ers will compete to create something SWEET! Teams of 4-H members will compete at the Kentucky State Fair, and will



Country Ham Recipe Contest

Youth must use their knowledge of food and nutrition, creativity, and communication skills to develop a recipe for country hams. With two categories to choose from, youth are encouraged to be creative and explore this Kentucky food. The first round allows youth to submit their original recipes and display their knowledge of food and develop a recipe using country ham. The Finals provide the opportunity to demonstrate their organization skills, culinary skills, and demonstration skills. In the "Finals" section you will find more details about that event.

Youth will be able to enter in one or more of the following categories: Jr. Sweet, Jr. Savory, Sr. Sweet, and Sr. Savory. The deadline to submit an original recipe to the state is **May 1st**. Finals will take place on **Thursday**, **August 24th** in Cloverville at the Kentucky State Fair. The Deadline to register will be the same as the Country Ham Contest Deadline, **December 9th**, **4 PM CT**.

Global Table

Experience food cultures of different countries and connect with young people across the world! As part of the 4-H Global Table program, 4-H'ers will exchange recipes with young people in Taiwan, Papua New Guinea, The Netherlands, or Argentina. Additionally, young people will prepare recipes provided to them by their counterparts from the young person they are paired with and share their experience at the ending celebration via zoom.

What is 4-H Cloverbuds?

Just like the 4-H program for older youth, the purpose of the 4-H Cloverbuds is to help young children learn life skills to become competent, caring and contributing citizens. Specifically, Cloverbuds are youth who are five to eight years old or in kindergarten through the second grade.

Cloverbuds help young people:

- 1. Learn more about themselves and the world around them
- 2. Develop positive attitudes about learning new things by hands-on involvement
- 3. Develop a relationship with a caring adult or older youth helper
- 4. Learn about the 4-H Youth Development program

The primary goal of the Cloverbuds program is to promote children's healthy development - mentally, physically, socially and emotionally. The Cloverbuds program provides an excellent opportunity for children to reach their highest potential because early life experiences, even subtle ones, affect future development.

4-H Cloverbud programs are not a mandatory component of the Kentucky 4-H Youth Development

Why should I keep records in 4-H?

Records are an important *Life Skill* that all young people need to learn and practice throughout their lives. What should I include on my 4-H Point Sheet?



Livestock Volunteer Certification

In order for a county to offer livestock and horse projects through 4-H, at least one volunteer per club/group must complete specific specialized training. That volunteer must continue to hone his/her knowledge and skills in youth development and animal science to continue as a "certified" volunteer. This is a step toward providing the finest educational experience for youth that we can.

How do I Become Certified?

- First contact Anna Denny, Extension Agent for the 4-H Youth Development Program.
- Attend and complete a Kentucky 4-H Livestock/Horse Certification Workshop. You may attend an in-person workshop, or a virtual workshop. These workshops will provide training and instruction on youth development, club management, teaching methods, and how to utilize the resource materials and curricula that have been developed.
- Complete a teaching practicum (typically done as a team with 2-4 other volunteer participants) to demonstrate your understanding of how to utilize the Livestock or Horse Resource Kit and curricula.
- Sign a contract which states that you agree to offer a minimum of nine hours of instruction per year, prior to the established deadline(s) for the livestock or horse projects/programs, and that you'll require the youth in their project/program unit to participate in a minimum of six hours of educational activities annually.
- To remain as a CVL, the volunteer must complete at least two hours of approved continuing educational training every year.

- Youth must get 6 hours of classroom instruction to compete at State Fair. We will have monthly meetings after school at Extension Office.
- Any youth 9-18 years old may participate.

2023 Piggy Bank Design Contest Official Rules

ADMINISTRATOR: University of Kentucky, Family and Consumer Sciences Extension c/o Kelly May, 112 Erikson Hall, Lexington, KY 40506. Email: k.may@uky.edu

CONTEST DESCRIPTION: Kentucky youth are asked to celebrate Kentucky Saves Week by using their creativity to make a piggy bank.

ELIGIBILITY: Contest is open only to school students attending public, private, or home school located within the Commonwealth of Kentucky enrolled in kindergarten through twelfth grade.

HOW TO ENTER: To enter the Contest, eligible youth ("Entrants") must:

- Create an original piggy bank design as described under Contest Timing and Entry Requirements.
- Submit Entry and Official Entry Form to Your Local County Cooperative Extension Office, Your County Extension Office Contact Information may be obtained at http://extension.ca.uky.edu/county. Entries must be delivered to the Cooperative Extension Office by: January 3, 2023
- Winning Entries at the area level must be selected by January 15, 2023.

CONTEST TIMING

Submit Entry by deadline. Must be submitted

by: January 3, 2023 to your local county extension office. Each Entry must be accompanied by an official Entry Form.

One (1) Entry per person during the Contest period. In the event more than one (1) Entry is received from any one person, the first Entry processed will be considered the only valid Entry and subsequent Entries from the same person will be disqualified.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Entries must meet the following requirements to be eligible for judging:

- The bank cannot exceed 12 inches X 12 inches X 12 inches (1 square foot).
- Piggy banks must be able to hold coins (i.e., include a slot that has been cut to insert coins).
- Piggy banks must be created or decorated by the youth contestant.
- Plastic or ceramic banks piggy banks may be used, but must be personally decorated.

- Piggy banks DO NOT have to be in the shape of a pig.
- You MAY use or repurpose other Piggy banks must be submitted and
- judged through the local Cooperative Extension Office. In addition, an Entry shall be void if it contains any material that sponsors or judges in their sole discretion deem patently offensive or inappropriate. such as, but not limited to, profanity. By submitting an Entry, the parent/ legal guardian of the Entrant represents and warrants that the entire Entry is the original work of the Entrant, not previously submitted or distributed elsewhere for any other purpose. The parent/legal guardian of the Entrant further warrants that he/she has obtained the consent of any persons parties portrayed in the Entry, Sponsors shall have the right to use/showcase the Entry in any manner, in any and all media, worldwide in perpetuity without further compensation or consent. Upon request of Sponsors, the parent/legal guardian of Entrant will provide a copy of any written consent as required above.

JUDGING CRITERIA/WINNER SELECTION AND VERIFICATION: Entries will be judged within

Extension Areas by a panel of judges coordinated by the Area piggy bank delegate. Each panel of judges will select one (1) winning Entry for a possible total of 12 winners statewide — 4 per Extension Region. The judges will review all Entries and select the winners based on the following criteria: originality. creativity, artistic design, and attractiveness. Judging of Entries and the determination of the winners will be completed by

January 4, 2023

The winner's name, grade, county, and winning Entry may be displayed at the State Capitol in Frankfort.

Any Entry, or portion of any Entry, which in the sole discretion of the judges (a) defames or infringes the right of privacy or publicity or other proprietary right of any person, living or deceased, or entity; and/or (b) is offensive, profane, obscene or not in keeping with the image of the Sponsors will be disqualified.
