Breckinridge County 4-H Rabbit Club meets monthly. Members, whether they are 4-H age or cloverbud members, learn skills to care for

Home School Club

This club is open to homeschoolers of all ages. Activities are geared toward elementary school ages, and older members are encouraged to take a leadership role as we touch on a variety of topics throughout the year.

Livestock Club

4-H livestock programs and projects have a long history in Kentucky. These livestock activities provide youth with opportunities to learn about



livestock and develop the life skills that are needed to be positive contributors to society. Through livestock programs and projects youth learn about livestock selection and evaluation, nutrition and feeding, health and daily care, reproduction, marketing, career opportunities, and much more. In addition, youth learn the importance of hard work and responsibility, and also develop important life skills, such as, critical thinking, decision-making, and communication.

Currently, the Breckinridge County Youth Livestock Club meets monthly with activities to help members complete beef, goat, lamb, and swine projects. Many local youth show livestock at the County Fair, District Shows, and KY State Fair; gaining experience caring for and showing livestock, while developing leadership, teamwork, communication, and other life skills.

Shooting Sports Club

The purpose of the Breckinridge County 4-H Shooting Sports Club is to give instruction, advice and guidance in the safe operation of firearms and bows and to make opportunities available for youth development. The program is to provide a knowledge base, skill development and wholesome attitude about safely handling firearms, recreational shooting, citizenship, scholarship and leadership.



Poultry Club

Poultry-related activities provide a wide range of learning opportunities. There are several low cost poultry projects that require very little space, making them a suitable project for those interested in animal science but don't have the resources to keep a cow, sheep or pig. There are also large-scale poultry projects (e.g., managing a breeding flock), but no matter the cost of the birds or the facilities used, they have the same learning value. 4-H poultry projects provide youth and their families with diverse learning environments - poultry are an excellent model to teach nutrition, physiology, genetics, record keeping, production and health management. Participation in competitive events teach sportsmanship, and character. Because a poultry project involves living creatures, it requires regular care and management developing these life skills in the participants.

Cloverbuds

This club is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program. This is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and to exhibit projects at the fair. Cloverbuds are open for all Breckinridge County youth ages 5 to 8. Topics that members may learn throughout the year include: Science and Technology, Community,

Expressive Arts, Healthy Living, Environmental/Earth Science, Personal Development, Citizenship /Civic Education, Consumerism/ Family Science, Plants & Animals.




STATE ELIGABLE 4-H PROJECTS

In order to be eligible to show and sell your animal at the Breckinridge County Fair, 4-H members must complete six hours of education within the Breckinridge County Livestock Club. Completed Educational hours with a High School FFA program may count towards your hours. All livestock that are intended for show at a county, district and/or state show must be properly identified. HOW TO ENTER: To enter the Contest, eligible youth ("Entrants") must:

- Create an original piggy bank design as described under Contest Timing
- and Entry Requirements.
 Submit Entry and Official Entry Form to Your Local County Cooperative Extension Office. Your County Extension Office Contact Information may be obtained at <u>http://extension.ca.uky.edu/county</u>. Entries must be delivered to the Cooperative Extension Office by: January 3, 2023
- Winning Entries at the area level must be selected by January 15, 2023.

CONTEST TIMING:

Submit Entry by deadline. Must be submitted by: January 3, 2023

to your local county extension office. Each Entry must be accompanied by an official Entry Form. One (1) Entry per person during the Contest period. In the event more than one (1) Entry is received from any one person, the first Entry processed will be considered the only valid Entry and subsequent Entries from the same person will be disqualified.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Entries must meet the following requirements to be eligible for judging:

- The bank cannot exceed
 12 inches X 12 inches
- (1 square foot).

Each panel of judges will select one (1) winning Entry for a possible total of 12 winners statewide — 4 per Extension Region. The judges will review all Entries and select the winners based on the following criteria: originality, creativity, artistic design, and attractiveness. Judging of Entries and the determination of the winners will be completed by:

January 4, 2023

The winner's name, grade, county, and winning Entry may be displayed at the State Capitol in Frankfort. Any Entry, or portion of any Entry, which in the sole discretion of the judges (a) defames or infringes the right of privacy or publicity or other proprietary right of any person, living or deceased, or entity; and/or (b) is offensive, profane, obscene or not in keeping with the image of the Sponsors will be disqualified.

HELP US GROW... VOLUNTEER!

The HEART of 4-H

One thing that is certainly clear in Breckinridge County and all of Kentucky: The 4-H Program would not exist without all of our wonderful volunteers. In every part of the state, 4-H volunteers coordinate 4-H community clubs, lead 4-H projects, and help to plan and conduct local, regional, state, and national 4-H events. There are a variety of ways in which people may volunteer for 4-H. Many volunteer roles involve working directly with others; others do not. There are seven specific types of 4-H volunteer roles in Kentucky.



Community Club Leader

A person who works with a 4-H community club's function is to assist the club's members in planning the annual club program, conducting club business and enrolling individually or as a group in one or more 4-H projects. Members of a community club are usually from a small geographic area. Clubs must have a minimum of five members, at least three officers and a volunteer leader.

Special Emphasis Volunteer

This is an individual who works with a 4-H group and offers a series of activities designed to meet the needs and interests of youth within a community or county. This is different that a Project Club Leader in that the youth do not belong to a "club." (Officers are not elected and the activities are generally shorter term and culminate in the completion of an activity.) An example could be a County Ham Volunteer, who organizes the CountyHam project, but doesn't engage the members in club meetings or activities. The special emphasis volunteer often coordinates the program or a part of it. A second example would be a camp volunteer.

4-H Committee Member

Individuals may participate as members of standing (long-term) or special (temporary, ad hoc) committees. Committee members often have less direct involvement with youth and serve in more of an administrative role in the 4-H program.

Project Club Leader

This position is nearly identical to the Community Club Leader with two important exceptions:

- the project leader is an "expert" or serves as a resource in one specific project area
- project clubs are usually county-wide and are not restricted to specific locations within the county.

Project Clubs must have a minimum of five members, at least three officers and a volunteer leader. An example of a Project Club Leader includes a Horse Club Leader or a Livestock Club Leader, in which on-going programming is offered, membership is county-wide, club officers are elected and conduct the meeting.

School Enrichment Volunteer

Any individual, often a classroom teacher, who works with a 4-H program in a formal classroom setting. This program may be either short- or long-term (throughout the school year). School enrichment programs are offered during school hours to enrich the formal education experience. A school enrichment program focuses on hands-on experiences and provides real life application of knowledge gained, increasing the understanding of difficult concepts, development of life skills and fosters the development of youth as young adults. Examples include Reality Store Volunteers, Speech or Demonstration Judges, etc.

4-H Council Member

4-H Council members oversee the county-wide 4-H program. This is a formal, decision-making group serving in an administrative role. Councils generally schedule from 6 to 12 meetings each year and have broad discretion in programmatic oversight.

Volunteer Application Process

Interested in becoming an official Breckinridge County 4-H Volunteer? Reach out to your 4-H Youth Development Education Extension Agent, Anna Denny. All new volunteers will need to go through this application process to be eligible for approval:

- 1. Completed and returned Volunteer Application Packets
- 2. All reference forms returned to the office
- 3. Motor Vehicle Records and required Background checks completed
- 4. In person interview with the 4-H Youth Development Educator



The HEART of 4-H

One thing that is certainly clear in Breckinridge County and all of Kentucky: The 4-H Program would not exist without all of our wonderful volunteers. In every part of the state, 4-H volunteers coordinate 4-H community clubs, lead 4-H projects, and help to plan and conduct local, regional, state, and national 4-H events. As a 4-H Volunteer, you might...

- Lead a 4-H project in a subject area that excites you! If you have a passion or specialty in a subject, such as, robotics, horse and pony, fashion, foods, and more, you can help 4-H'ers develop life skills in this project area!
- Teach workshops! Have a skill or a fun craft that you wish to share with our 4-H members? I'm encouraging volunteer led workshops that keep our 4-H members active and engaged throughout the year.
- Judge at the county fair or at livestock events. If you have expertise in a 4-H project area, judging is a great way to help our 4-Hers grow in showcasing their hard work.
- Manage a 4-H community club. Schedule club meetings, train club officers, recruit parents to help out, be the communication link between your club and the extension office.
- Become a Certified Kentucky Livestock and Horse Volunteer.

Livestock and Horse Volunteer Certification Program

4-H livestock and horse programs/projects may seem to be about animals, but in reality they are about kids. Young people are important to us and we want to make sure that we provide the very best educational experience that we can. For most, animal and animal-related programs/projects will provide a wide variety of life lessons which will positively impact them for the rest of their lives, no matter what career path they choose to follow. For a few, an animal science project will lead to a career. While it is important for youth in livestock and horse programs/projects to gain a basic understanding of animal anatomy, daily care, nutrition, reproduction, and marketing, it's the learning from hands-on experience-making decisions, then seeing the results, and accepting responsibility for the care of a living animal-where lives of youth are forever changed.

In an effort to make sure that every young person involved in a 4-H animal science program/project has the best possible learning experience, Kentucky 4-H put into place a system of "certification" for 4-H volunteers. In order for a county to offer livestock and horse projects through 4-H, at least one volunteer per club/group must complete specific specialized training. That volunteer must continue to hone his/her knowledge and skills in youth development and animal science to continue as a "certified" volunteer. This is a step toward providing the finest educational experience for youth that we can.

THIS MONTH'S TOPIC: KEEPING TEETH HEALTHY

healthy mouth and teeth are important parts of a healthy body. There are many things that you can do to keep your teeth clean, strong and healthy. Do you know how to keep your teeth healthy? That's right; keeping your teeth healthy includes brushing, visiting the dentist, good food and drink choices and flossing.

Brushing your teeth

Dentists say you should brush your teeth for at least 2 minutes twice a day. Be sure to use a child-size toothbrush that is easy to hold, has soft bristles, and is comfortable to use.

• Gently brush all areas of your teeth, gums, and tongue. Move the brush back and forth gently in short strokes. Brush the top, front, and backsides of each tooth.

> • Brush for 2 to 3 minutes. Use a timer or play a favorite song while brushing your teeth to let you know when 2 minutes are up.

- Brush twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste. Fluoride prevents cavities by strengthening and protecting tooth enamel.
- After you have brushed your teeth, spit out all the toothpaste! Do not swallow it. Toothpaste is for cleaning your teeth, not your stomach!

Flossing your teeth

To keep your teeth and gums as healthy as possible, you need to use dental floss. Dental floss is a special kind of string for cleaning between your teeth. Cleaning between your teeth is just as important as brushing. Flossing helps remove bits of food and plaque from between the teeth where your toothbrush cannot reach. It helps keep your teeth and gums healthy. Flossing is not easy, so you should ask your parents or another grown-up to help you floss. You should floss your teeth very gently, once a day.

- Insert the floss in between two teeth and use a back and forth motion to clean. Gently bring the floss to the gum line, but do not force it under the gums.
- Repeat this process between all your teeth.





Proper nutrition

Brushing and flossing are very important ways to keep teeth clean and healthy, but there are a few more things that each of us can do. The foods we eat and the beverages we drink are very important for keeping our teeth healthy. Eating a nutritious mix of foods from all the food groups is the best way to keep your teeth and body healthy.

Dental visits

Visit your dentist regularly. Dentists help take care of your teeth by checking your teeth to see if they are healthy. They show you how to take good care of your teeth and fix cavities or repair teeth. Your dentist will tell you when your next visit should be.

Taking good care of your teeth is something that each of us can do. When you take care of your teeth, they can last a lifetime. Remember, healthy teeth are part of a healthy body.


